2011 Annual Campus Security Report Statement

The information and statistics contained in this publication are being presented in compliance with The Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act. Dodge City Community College's Campus Security department publishes this information to inform members of the campus community and other interested parties of incidents of crime and to educate them in effective crime prevention and safety measures so that they can make informed decisions relative to their safety. The crime statistics reflect incidents that occurred on any DCCC campus or on public property adjacent to the campuses. Dodge City Community College does provide residential facilities for on campus student housing. The Dodge City Community College Security Department has primary responsibility for categorizing, disseminating and publishing crime statistics collected on campus and includes statistics obtained from various local law enforcement entities including the Ford County Sheriff and Dodge City Police Department.

Dodge City Community College Security Department

The **Dodge City Community College Security Department** is located on the second floor of the Learning Resource Center, across from the Business Office and can be reached from anywhere on campus by calling 620-227-9311. **Dodge City Community College Security Department** has office an additional office located in the campus student housing of Shelden hall. The office is located on second of the residence hall. For on campus emergencies, dial 311 from a college telephone or 620-227-9311 from a regular phone. Campus security is provided by the Dodge City Community College, which has officers on duty seven days per week. Twelve part-time officers maintain a visible security presence and patrol the campus roadways, walkways, parking areas and buildings. Specific elements of the Campus Security mission include: accident investigation; crime prevention; vehicle assists; incident investigation; parking and traffic enforcement; emergency response; and disaster coordination.

Campus Security officers are a proprietary security force responsible for maintaining public order on campus. The approach to this responsibility is with professionalism and discretion and with the understanding that service to the campus community is paramount.

The Director of Security will supervise the Dodge City Community College Security department. Director of Security will have a Masters degree and experience with campus policing; Extensive and current knowledge of law enforcement, safety and security, and familiarity with college operations, policies, and procedures; knowledge of crime prevention, investigation, training,

patrol, NIMS based emergency preparedness, Clery and UCR compliance, parking and traffic control, emergency medical services, and budget management.

The Campus Security Coordinator is required to have previous law enforcement or security experience. In-service training consists of a 40-hour training block that covers basic security techniques, patrol, report writing, and other related subjects. Monthly updates regarding security and law enforcement, recent court decisions, trends in crime and new advancements in security techniques and equipment are reviewed. The Campus Security Coordinator, who maintains a cooperative relationship with all local, state and federal public safety agencies, investigates all criminal incidents and accidents. In addition to accident and criminal investigations, this cooperation includes training programs and special events coordination.

Campus Security officers are eight commissioned law enforcement officers and four non commissioned campus security personnel who are experienced in: cardiopulmonary resuscitation; accident investigation; patrol procedures; traffic control; report writing; human interaction; and enforcement of the Campus and Student Codes of Conduct. The Campus Security Commissioned Law Enforcement Officers carry firearms and do have arrest powers Ford County and the State of Kansas. Non commissioned campus security officers do not carry firearms and do not have arrest powers.

Additionally, Campus Security officers are required to have a high school diploma and at least one year of experience in police, security and/or military environment. All officers are encouraged to further their professional development through the tuition-waiver program and in-service training offered throughout the year. Periodic, office-sponsored training sessions are offered, dealing with basic campus safety, domestic violence, sexual assault prevention, unarmed self-defense and other in-service training relating to specific needs.

To carry out the security patrol mission, the **Dodge City Community College Security Department** operates in marked campus security vehicles. In addition college security department maintains a camera monitoring systems, supervised by **Dodge City Community College Security Department** and the Dean of Student in charge of Campus Student Housing. **Dodge City Community College Security Department** will monitor many interior public areas, labs, and high-risk areas as well as exterior parking lots.

The Dodge City Community College Security Department and maintenance are responsible for ensuring campus buildings are secured after hours.

CAMPUS SECURITY ASSISTANCE

Campus Security personnel provide assistance to the campus community in the following areas: vehicle assistance (jump starts); emergency response and CPR; information and directions; escorts to and from parking areas and classrooms; investigation of incidents/crimes occurring on campus; and patrol of campus roadways, walkways, parking areas and buildings. In addition, the department has the ability to conduct informational sessions addressing personal protection, crime prevention and sexual assault awareness and emergency preparedness. In situations requiring assistance from local based services Campus Security promptly summons help from local first responders.

HOW TO REPORT CRIMES OR INCIDENTS ON CAMPUSES

DCCC encourages students and employees to promptly report crimes on campus to Campus Security officers and local law enforcement agencies on a voluntary basis. Normally, crimes should be reported to the **Dodge City Community College Security Department** by dialing 3-1-1 from a campus phone to make contact with the officers.

Report crimes in person by coming to the second floor of the Learning Resource Center, LRC 211, by calling extension 352 from a campus phone or 620-227-9466 from a regular phone. To report crimes in progress at the other campuses, simply dial 9-1-1.

Furnish all pertinent information when reporting an incident. The Dodge City Community College Security Department working in conjunction with the local law enforcement agencies will conduct the appropriate investigation and file the necessary report(s). Follow-up pursuits will include efforts to identify responsible parties, recover stolen property, recommend appropriate legal action, pursue Judicial Code of Conduct Board actions with the chief Judicial Officer for the Judicial Code of Conduct Board and encourage restitution when feasible.

The Dodge City Community College Security Department maintains an excellent working relationship with local law enforcement agencies in the area.

The Ford County Sheriff department and Dodge City Police Department will provide assistance a prompt and professional manner when requested. The law enforcement agencies regularly provide current information and data concerning criminal activity in and around the DCCC campuses and any DCCC off campus event.

Crimes may also be reported to any Campus Security Authority - defined as any official of the College who has significant responsibility for student and campus activities. Campus Security Authorities include Vice President of Innovation & Workforce Development, Dean of Students, Athletic Director, Residence Life Director and Assistant Residence Life Director, Director of Admissions, Director of Child Development, all athletic team coaches and campus advisors to student clubs and organizations. The law requires that all crimes reported to any Campus Security Authority be included in the College's statistics and evaluated relative to its

timely warning policy. Professional mental health counselors are excluded from this requirement, however, the College encourages such mental health professionals to, when they believe it appropriate, inform the person being counseled of procedures to report crimes on a voluntary, confidential basis for inclusion in the annual report.

TIMELY WARNINGS POLICY

The Dodge City Community College Security Department maintains and reports yearly crime statistics, which are available at this link: [DLCCC crime statistics](#). When appropriate DCCC, will issue *timely warnings* to the campus community relative to potential criminal activity.

DCCC strives to provide safe and secure campus environments. Occasionally an incident may take place on our campuses or information is received from a local law enforcement agency regarding an incident that occurred in the immediate vicinity of one of the campuses which is considered potentially threatening. If any member of the campus community knows of a crime or other serious incident should report that incident as soon as possible to the Dodge City Community College Security Department or call 9-1-1 so that a timely warning can be issued. When we are made aware of such information, we will issue *timely warnings* through the campus email. The Dodge City Community College Security Department also maintains a daily crime log which is made available for public viewing on the website.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE AND EVACUATION

DCCC has implemented a comprehensive “**DC3 Alert Emergency Notification System**” that can alert and inform the campus community members in the event of an imminent threat to health and safety (e.g. tornado, active shooter, hazardous material spill, etc

Registration for the Emergency Notification System, DC3 Alert

Dodge City Community College has partnered with Rave Mobile Safety, the leader in mobile safety, to offer an emergency notification system. DC3 Alert is capable of sending users text, voice, and email messages in the event of class cancellations or campus emergencies. You can register to receive both email and cell phone text notification.

DC3 Alert is an essential tool for notification and communication. Within minutes of an emergency, College officials can use DC3 Alert to send a single, clear message to all Dodge City Community College staff, faculty, and students by text message, voice message, and/or e-mail. DC3 Alert can also be used to notify the College community of a closing due to inclement weather.

DC3 employees and students will need to log into my **DC3 web** located on the DC3 Home page. DC3 employees and students Login with your user name and password. The screen will then prompt you to the **DC3 Alert Emergency Notification System**. There is no charge and Dodge City Community College encourages all who are interested in campus notification to sign up.

Upon confirmation from the Dodge City Community College Security department or College officials regarding a significant emergency or dangerous situation involving an immediate threat to the health and safety of campus community members, emergency notifications will be disseminated without delay to campus community members via text message and email alerts.

The Director of Security, working in conjunction with other College officials will determine the content of the emergency notification, select the most appropriate method(s) for disseminating the information as quickly as possible, and initiate the notification system.

Emergency evacuation routes are conspicuously posted in each classroom and outside the building on our campuses. Additionally, various procedures for responding to emergencies can also be found on the College's Critical incident Management Plans

ACCESS TO CAMPUS FACILITIES

For security purposes, campus buildings are secured when classes and activities have finished each day. Facilities are kept secured during periods when college sanctioned functions are not being conducted. All persons required to be on campus when facilities are closed are required to carry student DCCC student or employee identification card. Persons requesting access to college facilities after hours will be required to show appropriate identification and state the reason for being on campus.

CRIME PREVENTION EDUCATION

The Dodge City Community College Security Officers patrol daily 7 days of week and security presence. As a regular part of their routine mobile and foot patrols, officers are alert for any deficiencies including broken door locks; inoperative lights and other conditions which might detract from the safety and security of the campus environment.

Anyone encountering a condition affecting campus safety and security should report it promptly to the Dodge City Community College Security Department or Maintenance. The Dodge City Community College Security Department, working in conjunction with the Residence life Staff will focus on Crime Prevention and Emergency Preparedness.

BASIC CRIME PREVENTION STEPS

Effective crime prevention begins with personal involvement and responsibility. By taking a few moments to think before acting, we can all make ourselves less likely to become a victim or a statistic. The following is a list of DOs and DON'Ts to help you in protecting your personal property and yourself. DO lock your car at all times - when parked and when driving; DO use the lighted walkways going to and from the parking lots; DO report all crimes and/or suspicious activities to Campus Security promptly; DO mark your valuable possessions (books, calculators, recorders, etc.) i.e. with your driver's license number; DO call Campus Security (620-227-9466) if you desire an escort; DO treat all personal property as you do cash; DO ask a friend to walk with you to the parking lot; DON'T leave valuables in plain sight in your vehicle (iPods, GPS devices, books). DON'T leave books, handbags, book bags, wallets, etc. unattended in the library, cafeteria, restrooms or study areas; Crime prevention is everyone's job. With some effort and forethought we can maintain a safe campus environment.

Weapons on Campus

The possession, carrying, use, distribution and sale of dangerous weapons of any type, ammunition or explosives are strictly prohibited on property owned or controlled by the college. The only exception is for authorized law enforcement officers or other persons specifically authorized by the college. Failure to comply with the college weapons policy will result in disciplinary action and/or prosecution.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE POLICY

Dodge City Community College does not condone the possession, use, manufacture or distribution of illegal substances or drug paraphernalia of any kind in any amount. Campus Community members in violation of this policy may be jeopardizing their own well-being as well as the well-being of the campus community.

Dodge City Community College is committed to providing a drug-free, safe environment for students, faculty, and staff. DCCC maintains "dry" campuses with the use of alcohol restricted.

Dodge City Community College (DCCC) clearly states it is unlawful for individuals to manufacture, possess, use and/or distribute illicit drugs and alcohol on the campus. Individuals who violate DCCC regulations and local, state and federal laws will be subject to disciplinary action, dismissal from DCCC and/or prosecution under applicable federal, state and/or local statutes.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT AND ASSAULT

Students and staff at Dodge City Community College have a right to an environment free of sexual harassment, not only by persons in positions of power, but by any DCCC employee or student. Sexual harassment constitutes a serious threat to the free interaction and exchange necessary for educational and personal development. Sexual harassment is not only a clear violation of College policy; it is a form of discrimination and is illegal. Students are protected under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act and Title IX of the Education amendments.

Sexual harassment is unwanted sexual attention such as staring, leering, ogling, sexual teasing, jokes, gestures, inappropriate touching, pressures for a date or sex, forced sexual relations or

suggestions that sex can be exchanged for grades or a promotion. It can happen to both men and women, but women are more often the victims.

Harassment may occur when a person in a position of control or influence over a person's grades, academic career, or job uses authority and power to gain sexual advantages and threatens or punishes for refusal. Another form of sexual harassment is peer harassment (by other students), and includes any of the above unwanted actions (except suggestions that can be exchanged for grade or promotions). Sexual harassment committed by students is a serious offense which could lead to dismissal from the college.

If an individual is the victim of sexual harassment they are encouraged to report such incidents promptly to the Dodge City Community College Security Department or local law enforcement. The Director of Human Resources will help individuals obtain counseling and file formal reports with the Equal Opportunity Action Officer.

If an individual is the victim of a sexual assault, formal charges alleging sexual assault occurring on any campus may be lodged with the Dodge City Community College Security Department office which will make immediate contact with the local law enforcement agency in order to ensure a prompt and thorough investigation of the occurrence.

What to Do If You Are Sexually Assaulted:

- Find a safe environment away from your attacker and call 9-1-1 immediately! If possible, ask a trusted friend to stay with you. And, remember, it's not your fault you were attacked.
- Write down everything you can remember about your attacker (physical description, location of the attack, etc.)
- Preserve evidence of the attack. Though you may want to, do not bathe or brush your teeth. Do not wash or get rid of any of the clothing that you were wearing.
- If the incident occurred on any campus, immediately report the assault to the Campus Security department or dial 9-1-1. Security officers will assist the victim in notifying the local law enforcement agency.
- Seek medical attention. Even if you don't think you're injured, it's important to test for STDs and pregnancy. Ask the hospital to conduct a rape kit exam and, if you think that you have been drugged, collect a urine sample for analysis by a lab.

Sexual Assault Disciplinary Procedure Guarantees:

- Both the accuser and accused shall be informed of the outcome or any campus disciplinary proceeding brought alleging a sexual assault
- The accuser and the accused will be treated with dignity, courtesy and professionalism

Students found guilty of such violations under the College's Code of Student Conduct and Kansas law are subject to disciplinary sanctions up to and including suspensions, expulsions and prosecution. College officials will assist victims of sexual assault/harassment with any class schedule adjustment(s).

The Dodge City Community College Security Department will work working in conjunction with Residence Life Staff to make students aware of Sexual Assault Prevent. To reach your local rape crisis center, call the National Sexual Assault Hotline at 1-800-656-HOPE (4673).

Parking Regulations

Parking is not allowed in the entrance or exit drives. Service drives are to be used by service vehicles only. Visitor parking, indicated with appropriate signs, is reserved for visitors to campus. Parking is not permitted in designated reserved parking spaces. Except as otherwise posted, the speed limit is 15 miles per hour on campus roads and driveways.

Vehicle Registration Requirements

A parking sticker is required for parking at Dodge City Community College. Students may purchase semester passes for a \$10 fee in the Student Services area in the Student Center or the Residence Hall Office. The parking permit must appear in the lower left corner of the rear window of the vehicle.

Clery Act Criminal Offense Definitions

- ❖ **Arson:** Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle, aircraft or other personal property of another.
- ❖ **Robbery:** The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.
- ❖ **Aggravated assault:** An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury.
- ❖ **Burglary:** The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft.

- ❖ **Motor vehicle theft:** The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. A motor vehicle is self-propelled and runs on the surface and not on rails. Specifically excluded from this category are motorboats, construction equipment, airplanes, and farming equipment.
- ❖ **Forcible rape:** The carnal knowledge of a person, forcibly and/or against that person's will or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent.
- ❖ **Forcible sodomy:** Oral or anal sexual intercourse with another person, forcibly and/or against that person's will or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent.
- ❖ **Sexual assault with an object:** The use of an object or instrument to unlawfully penetrate, however slightly, the genital or anal opening of the body by another person, forcibly and/or against that person's will or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent.
- ❖ **Forcible fondling:** The touching of the private parts of another person for the purpose of sexual gratification, forcibly and/or against that person's will or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent.
- ❖ **Incest:** Non-forcible sexual intercourse between persons who are related to each other within the degrees wherein marriage is prohibited by law.
- ❖ **Statutory rape:** Non-forcible sexual intercourse with a person who is under the age of consent.
- ❖ **Murder and non-negligent manslaughter:** The willful killing of one human being by another.
- ❖ **Negligent manslaughter:** The killing of another person through gross negligence.
- ❖ **Larceny-theft:** The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession, or constructive possession, of another person.
- ❖ **Simple assault:** An unlawful physical attack by one person upon another where neither the offender displays a weapon, nor the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration, or loss of consciousness.
- ❖ **Intimidation:** To unlawfully place another person in reasonable fear of bodily harm through the use of threatening words and/or other conduct, but without displaying a weapon or subjecting the victim to actual physical attack.
- ❖ **Destruction, damage, or vandalism of property:** To willfully or maliciously destroy, damage, deface, or otherwise injure real or personal property without the consent of the owner or the person having custody or control of it.
- ❖ **Hate crimes:** Any of the crimes listed above, if perpetrated against someone on the basis of race, gender, religion, sexual orientation, ethnicity or disability.

- ❖ **Weapons law violations:** The violation of laws or ordinances dealing with weapon offenses, regulatory in nature, such as manufacture, sale or possession of deadly weapons; carrying deadly weapons, concealed or openly; furnishing deadly weapons to minors; aliens possessing deadly weapons; and all attempts to commit any of the aforementioned.
- ❖ **Drug law violations:** The violation of state and local laws relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing and making of narcotic drugs.
- ❖ **Liquor law violations:** The violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, transporting, furnishing or possession of intoxicating liquor; maintaining unlawful drinking places; bootlegging; operating a still; furnishing liquor to a minor or in-temperate person; using a vehicle for illegal transportation of liquor; drinking on a train or public conveyance; and all attempts to commit any of the aforementioned.
