DCCC hires new interim president

The Dodge City Community College Board of Trustees approved a contract for a second interim president during its meeting Monday night.

Dr. Don A. Woodburn will take over interim president duties beginning Jan. 17, 2011. The contract states Dr. Woodburn will be employed for a period of six months or until a permanent president is found. The contract may be extended longer than six months if necessary.

Current interim president Dr. Richard Gilliland will continue his duties until Jan. 6, 2011.

Dr. Woodburn was born and raised in New Mexico, with agricultural roots. His father was an agricultural extension specialist, rancher, and cattle feedlot owner. Growing up, he was an award-winning participant in sports and the livestock business in both 4-H and FFA. He was formally educated in

the animal sciences at Oklahoma Panhandle State University, Michigan State University and Colorado State University.

College activities included football, inter-collegiate livestock judging and student government. His early professional life as an animal science instructor and intercollegiate livestock judging team coach were award-winning.

Since completing the requirements for the Ph.D.

(Animal Science) in 1981, Dr. Woodburn has progressively succeeded in numerous senior administrative and general management positions in industry and community colleges. These include: Division Dean – Colby Community College; Dean, Agriculture & Science - Los Angeles Pierce Community College; Vice President, Chief Instructional Officer - Lassen Community College; President, Research Information Services

- Susanville, CA; Dean (CEO) - University of Nebraska College of Technical Agriculture; and President - Coffeyville Community College.

Dr. Woodburn's last two administrative positions, spanning a period of fifteen years, include not only an emphasis on academics and activities, but multiple athletic programs as well. Dr. Woodburn was a student-athlete. He has spent a lifetime of involvement in a variety of academic, athletic and other student/administrative responsibilities.

Dr. Woodburn is an academic leader highly motivated by student welfare and success and is a sponsor of innovative educational curricula and programs. He has broad-based experience with and sensitivity to ethnic and culturally diverse populations. He has excellent personnel management skills and is committed to community success. Dr. Woodburn has been described as visionary, a team builder, having strong leadership qualities, a delegating management style and has excellent communication, public relations and fundraising skills.

In other business the Board:

- Approved the 2011-2012 Residence Hall Room and Board rates. The rates increased 2.8 percent to keep up with food and utility costs.
- Approved the Tuition and Fees recommendation for 2011-2012. The recommendation was not to increase tuition or fees for the 2011-2012 school year.
- Approved the Renewable Energy Grant Agreement between the Kansas Corporation Commission and the college. The grant will help fund the installation of heat pumps for the new residence hall.
- Approved the advertising contract between AT&T Real Yellow Pages and the college to provide listings in the 2011 telephone directory.
- Approved an agreement between the College and United Way of Dodge City. The Adult Learning Center and United Way of Dodge City agree to work cooperatively to increase the public's awareness and support of United Way of Dodge City.
- Approved the purchase of a 2000 Wabash 36-foot flatbed trailer from Chuck Henry Sales Inc. for \$9,850 to complete equipment needs for CDL training. The trailer will be purchased using Vocational Capital Outlay Funds.
- Approved the purchase of 20 desktop computers to be placed in the Computer Science Building for \$31,902.36 from Dell Marketing. Funds will be provided by Title V.
- Approved the farm lease between Stueckemann Farms Inc. and the College for \$1,800.
- Approved an agreement between the College and Colby Community College. The agreement will allow students enrolling in the Veterinary Technology Program the option to transfer courses from DCCC to Colby Community College as prerequisite courses.
- Approved a barter agreement between the College and AT&T Advertising Solutions. The agreement will allow for a photo marketing the College to appear on the cover of the 2011 telephone directory.
- Approved the lease of a car from Magouirk Chevrolet-Cadillac Inc. for \$435 per month for 18 months.
- Approved the employment contract for Susan J. Aistrup, Professor of Nursing.
- Approved the employment contract for Greg Patee, Facilities Maintenance & Operations Supervisor.
- Approved the employment contract for Nicole M. Noble, Guided Studies Coordinator.
- Approved the employment contract for Tim Romanello, Head Men's and Women's Soccer Coach/Student Recruiter.
- Approved the employment contract for Rusty Morgan, Assistant Football Coach/Student Recruiter.
- Accepted the resignation of Robert J. Ganley, Director of Security.
- Approved the employment contract for Robert J. Ganley, Director of Student Support Services.
- Accepted the resignation of Patrick Charles Pfeifer, Associate Dean of Instruction.
- Accepted the resignation of Michael Garrison, Assistant Football Coach.
- Approved the request for early retirement for Barney G. Korbelik, Director of Physical Plant.
